Creche scenes (or Manger scenes) were first introduced by St. Francis of Assisi in 1223 AD. At Holy Trinity Church each year we build a "Manger" during the Christmas Season. It begins simply and grows throughout the season. Today, the scene is finally complete, with all the characters and symbols added. May this Creche (Manger) scene remind us all to worship the Incarnate Lord of All.

Worship Notes for This Week

Though the Feast of Epiphany already occurred last Thursday, we will use the Propers for Epiphany instead of the those for the First Sunday after the Epiphany. These are found on page 107-109 of the Book of Common Prayer. The opening voluntary is an organ arrangement of The Three Noels.
